

Fraudsters try to charge for Corona vaccine by fake calls

During this spring, more and more people will be offered vaccination. It's always free of charge, but now fraudsters have started cheating. They are trying to make people pay by fake phone calls. The police expect it to get worse.

All adults living in Sweden will be vaccinated against Corona (COVID-19) if they wish.

Now the police have noticed that there are fraudsters trying to trick you. They might call you and say they want to make an appointment for vaccination and then ask you to pay.

Or they might say they need to confirm that they are speaking to the right person, and ask you to sign in with your bank ID.

Don't be tricked by fraudsters

- Never log on with your bank ID, log-in cards, or your card reader if someone calls.
- Never give out numbers from pay cards.
- Never give out numbers or personal codes, from log-in cards or your card reader.

Serious organizations, companies or authorities NEVER ask you to do so via telephone.

If you become suspicious, you should:

- Hang up the phone.
- Check the website www.1177.se for information on how the Kalmar County Council (Region Kalmar län) does when booking. Or call your local health centre and ask.
- If you have home care or home health care: check with the municipality.

If you have been tricked, or if someone has tried to trick you:

- Call or email the bank immediately for help stopping the money.
- Contact the police. Call 112 for ongoing crime, or 114 14 if you want to report incidents.
